Krakow: the historical capital of Poland until the end of the 16th century, was the seat of Polish kings and a center of culture and science. It is an old historical town with many significant sites: the Royal Wawel Castle, numerous old and beautiful Catholic churches, sites bearing traces of historic Jewish culture, and Jagiellonian University - one of the oldest universities in the world; Krakow's Historical Center (Old Town) is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
